The participants were all those that attended the first BCE meeting in 2021.



To increase frank feedback, the survey was designed to by anonymous. Where names are mentioned, permission was sought.




Do you have solar? If so what type?

Solar (grid connected).




Great place for a chat. Learn more about renewable energy. Too casual and unstructed to be a primary source of decision making for me to go with more solar for my home.

#### What was your favourite BCE meeting and why?

## What do you want to see more of?

More engagement from the floor. Discussion around solutions other than pumped hydro.

Progress towards goals.

More education in general about what they can do: solar, energy savings for their house.

Small achievable projects. Rather than biting off more than we can chew at an early stage.

At AGM we passed a resolution to get consultants to do a feasibility study (?)



## What do you want to see MORE of?

Education sessions about the news and practical information to attract more members i.e. how to insulate your home or make use of renewable power sources available on your property (hydro, wind, solar, battery, biogas etc.).

Change of focus and strategy. Last meeting highlighted the meetings need structure and a need for change. We heard from Geoff who raised number points already raised. He then referred to Richard and Paul and they all said what they said at previous meetings. So wasn't any progression of anything or any reason for actually having the meeting. If it is to become an information spreading session then there needs to be new information. Or if is going to be an idea that is going to galvanise on certain actions there needs to be a process to make those actions - give momentum to them.



## What do you want to see MORE of?

Progress. Do agree that first meeting had new ideas and potential broad range of what the organisation was about. In addition to the pumped hydro idea (which I think is brilliant), helping people with insulation in their homes, there's lots of possibility. Everyone is trying to be polite with everybody and everybody needs to be heard and that's important but we need to get to the point, like Helen did.

Discussion on EV charge stations. Would be good to have an EV charge station in Braidwood. We could lobby for it. Near the playground would be ideal as it is off street, does not infringe on other cars, it's near toilets, park, pool and there's coffee nearby.



## What do you want to LESS more of?

Talk about political parties. I think it is possible to break down current events into practical information that explains the facts without name calling.

Going over the same territory.

Lack of implementation process.

Wasted time talking about what was discussed at the last meeting.

Politics. I'd like to see no politics (national). You can't have politics in a community based forum to start with.

Dwindling numbers around the group. Attrition.

Richard's stuff (referring to the news articles) is good but doesn't move us forward. Mostly read it already.



#### Constructive Comments (not sought, simply given)

- Nothing has really happened. Who, what, how, no promises, nothing on website then stuff gone up recently.
- Wasn't aware specific topics were no longer discussed. Enthusiastic about off grid i.e. helping those in the community go off-grid or those that are off grid. Yet I told it was taken off the agenda I was told someone who was not a committee member.
- I'd like to see small lectures and information sharing so people can come along and learn something. Not large projects.
- Sue Rendell "Ran the folks music club while the festival became the main event we still ran the club meetings which were not about the festival and this worked well. Can boil a few pots at the same time. Do the small stuff that you can do easily as well as taking on something a bit bigger."
- Need a vision so can buy into it. Our community will get stronger if we find ways around for ourselves.



### Comments on meeting frequency...

Quarterly curated meetings sounds about right.

Frequency is fine. COVID affected it but that's understandable.


Fine to have 1 per quarter. With no clear objective or agenda more frequent meetings will not serve a purpose.

main grid)




#### Comments on 4 ideas

- Trying to raise enthusiasm and awareness. For a lot of people if there is no a personal benefit then you are not going to get the support if the carrot isn't cheaper power then they can't be bothered with it.
- Could include provision and generation of clean power however it is certainly about encouraging the use of clean energy in Braidwood.
   Education is one way. Having a cooperative approach to buying batteries and solar to get a discount is another as is more insulation in houses. Have the poles and wires already (re microgrid) best make use of them
- Our community will get stronger if we find ways around for ourselves. Important to educate the greater community. Try to bring more people into the net i.e. those that don't have knowledge in the community.



Four ideas have been floated on what BCE could do for the community.

Which of these 4 ideas do you support?



Only 6 people were asked these questions from 8. Both of the 2 missing people said: "Not aware of the 4 ideas, saying "only the pumped hydro is talked about" and "vision seems to be pumped hydro and no other". These people also said "BCE should be wholistic and look at all technologies". said "a microgrid is a great idea" (this was prompted by 2040 not BCE).



#### Comments on 4 ideas

- 4. is the best use of our time.
- If 1, 2 and 3 are being paid for and run by the government fine but not paid for and run by local people. I support the idea of small hydro system. They have these in Canberra and Warragamba Dam but this should be paid for and run by the grid.
- Interested in all the options if viable and if they are the best and the right solution then that's good. Depends on the relative costs, what the business case is for one vs. the other. Not excluding any of them BCE is a forum to get to the answer as to which is the most viable.
- Not aware of the 4 ideas. Only the pumped hydro is talked about. Bit vague what everyone is trying to achieve. 3. After screening of 2040. Would like to have a microgrid within the greater grid. If cut off from the main grid our microgrid will work for us. This gives us a greater voice. This is important for people to feel empowered.

## **Pumped hydro concept**

## **Battery Options**

#### What other ideas do you have for BCE to look at?

Local river flow hydro using the Shoalhaven or Mongarlowe River. Not going to generate more than what 1 individual could use. Micro power supplies. Energy going down the river at the moment and could be used by a small number of people. We could investigate the river power (Rainbow Power has options) and the council requirements to do this locally but would only benefit those on the river. Sometimes the river doesn't even flow but other years it doesn't generate much at all. Must look at ROI over 5-10 years and find not feasible due to drought years. Rainbow Power has turbine has these types of things and help back up fridge and lights. Might also need permission from council. If you live on the river you can put something in it.
